WHAT IS ANTHROPOLOGY?

The word 'anthropology' is derived from the Greek words 'Anthropos' meaning human and 'logos' meaning science or study of. Anthropology, therefore, literally translates to "the study of human beings". It is this broad and holistic approach that distinguishes Anthropology from other disciplines concerned with humankind. This is what also makes it a multidisciplinary subject applicable to a wide range of fields.

BENEFITS OF STUDYING ANTHROPOLOGY

Completing a course in Anthropology will allow students to expand their worldview, improve their cross-cultural awareness, and understand how various aspects of our reality like our various languages and environmental contexts help to shape our experience of the world.

ABOUT OUR COURSES

These courses are all four credits each and there are no prerequisite courses to register for any of them. However, students in their first year would be encouraged to take the introductory course--ANT1201 - Introduction to Anthropology--and students in their second to fourth years may take this course or any of our specialized courses.
