
Tutition Free for Guyanese Students

UG in Brief

The University of Guyana, the accredited national University of Guyana, now in its 62nd year, was founded in October 1963, three years before Guyana became independent. "UG", as it is fondly referred to, offers over 180 distinct programmes in over 80 disciplines, from Certificates, Diplomas, associate degrees, Bachelor's Degrees, and Master's Degrees to Ph.D.'s. These programmes are offered in online, face-to-face or blended formats. UG delivers through a system of eight campuses. This includes its 37-year-old community-based Institute for Distance and Continuing Education (IDCE) and the second central campus at Tain in Berbice, celebrating its 25th anniversary in 2025, as well as the pathbreaking Maoka Taawa Forest Campus. The University of Guyana's student population is over 11,500.

Through its 9 Faculties and 13 Research Institutes and Centers. including an accredited College of Medical Sciences, School of Entrepreneurship and Business Innovation and the Faculty of Earth and Environmental Sciences which has been ranked # 5 globally, "UG" has provided education, training and research for over 71,000 alumni over its 62- year history with significant national and global impact. Key faculties include the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, the Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry, the Faculty of Natural Sciences, the College of Behavioral Sciences and Research, the Faculty of Education and Humanities and the Faculty of Social Sciences. The University's 10 Research Institutes include the recently launched Institute for Marine and Riverine Ecologies and Economies (IMAREE), the internationally important Centre for Biodiversity, the Institute for Food and Nutrition Security, the Institute for Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship, the Institute for Energy Diplomacy, the Green Institute, the Institute of Gender Studies, the Institute for Human Resiliency, Strategic Security and the Future, and the International Centre for Excellence in Early Childhood Education.




FACULTY OF EARTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES

Am I eligible?

How do I gain admission to UG?

- 1. Applicants must be at least sixteen (16) years of age in the calendar year of admission to the University except in instances where the regulations for a specific programme otherwise specify.
- 2. Applicants must meet the **general** admissions requirements set out by the Academic Divisions to which the Applicant is applying.



Kindly note, however, that in addition to the academic criteria which students must satisfy, admission into a programme of study is also dependent on the availability of space on the particular programme chosen by the applicant.

Some programmes are very competitive to gain admission.
Students have the option of selecting up to three programmes when they are applying for admission.

It is recommended that students select up to three programmes when applying for admission.

Persons of mature age (a minimum of 21 years in the calendar year of entry to the University) who do not meet the minimum requirements but who can satisfy the University that they have had a suitable education may be considered for admission.

Where there is a variation of the above, it will be shown under the respective Academic Divisions's admission requirements.



- Holders of CXC Associate Degree (Arts / Science) may be admitted into a 2-year or 3-year Bachelor's Degree programme.
- CAPE (I and II Units per subject as appropriate) grades I to V are acceptable, but grades I to III may qualify for exemption as determined by the respective Academic Unit.
- GCE 'A' Levels (I and II Units per subject as appropriate) grades A to E are acceptable but grades A to C may qualify for exemption as determined by the respective Academic Unit.
- GCE 'O' Levels (Grades A- E) are acceptable.
- IGCSE grades A- E are acceptable.
- The acceptance of CSEC Grade III applies only to the results for examinations taken in June 1998 and thereafter.
- Applicants with five as stipulated above, without the requisite English or Mathematics or any other prescribed subject, at the acceptable grade, may be permitted to write a Qualifying Examination in the respective subject area or do the foundation course offered by IDCE in the respective subject area.
- Applicants who possess either of the basic entry requirements mentioned above but still
 do not satisfy the requirements of a particular Department may be required to pass the
 prescribed foundation courses where offered.
- Applicants of mature age (i.e. a minimum of 21 years in the calendar year in which entry is being sought) who do not meet any of the admission requirements will be required to write the UG Entrance Examination.
- Students who were previously admitted to the University and who attended and successfully completed at least a semester or, at most a year, may be granted re-entry on the basis of the following:
 - Their pre-university qualifications and their university credits even though the criterion under which they were admitted previously no longer pertains.
 - These persons must have been students within the preceding five (5) years of application.
- Certification from other relevant Tertiary Institutions that are registered with the National Accreditation Council or Accreditation Council in other jurisdictions can be admitted into year 1 /2 of the respective programme as determined by the transcript.
- Applicants may be asked to attend Interviews.

¹ A Special Sitting of the Academic Board on November 3, 2015 unanimously approved that the number of sittings as a requirement for admissions be removed from the General Entry Requirement.

Students' who have attained Grades Four and Five at the CSEC level may matriculate in any University of Guyana Certificate programme in order to become eligible for entry into the University of Guyana Bachelor Degree Programme.

Persons Eligible for the University of Guyana Entrance Examination

- Those applicants who are qualified for admission by virtue of relevant passes at the CSEC General Proficiency/IGCSE/GCE 'O' Level and other approved qualification WILL NOT be required to write the UGEE.
- Those applicants who expect to qualify for admission by virtue of relevant passes at the May/June IGCSE/GCE/CSEC examination may opt to write the UGEE.
- Those applicants who fall into one of the following categories will be required to write the UGEE:
- Those applying for admission under the Mature Student category.
- Those applying for admission with Certificates or Diplomas which had been previously accepted for admission purposes OTHER THAN:
 - The Diploma in Agriculture for applicants to the Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry.
 - The Trained Teachers' Certificate for applicants to those programmes that allow this qualification as an entry requirement.
 - A Diploma from any of the (Government) Technical Institutes for applicants to the Faculties of Natural Sciences, and Technology, and College of Medical Sciences unless otherwise stipulated by the Academic Board.
 - The IDCE Certificate in Industrial Relations and Management.
 - The Commonwealth Youth Programme Diploma in Youth Work.
 - Any other qualification approved by the Academic Board.

Pre-University

- Pre-University courses, certificates, and diplomas from reputable entities, including IDCE, but not specific to Industrial Relations, used as matriculation requirements should be accepted.
- Qualifications from an acceptable level from an accredited or recognised entity, such as regionally, e.g. Caribbean Vocational Qualification (CVQ), nationally, e.g. from the Get Ready for Opportunities to Work (GROW) programme; which connects internationally to, e.g. The Scottish Credit Qualification Framework (SCQF) and the General Education Diploma (GED), should be considered as entry-level requirements.

Where it is determined that a person gained admission to the University of Guyana without fulfilling the stated admission requirements for his/her programme, an investigation shall be conducted into the circumstance(s) of the said admission.

If the investigation reveals that admission was obtained in any manner other than that provided for in the University's Regulations governing Admission, the person will be withdrawn from the programme to which he/she was admitted.

However, such withdrawal would not prevent that person from being eligible for admission to the University (at the regular time for admission) whenever the admission requirements are met.
